



A project to restore and protect Lake George

Years ago West Brook was channelized and the surrounding wetlands were filled for development. Because of the loss of wetlands and extensive stormwater pollution from upstream properties and highways, West Brook has become the single biggest source of sediment, carrying nutrients and pollution to Lake George.

The West Brook Conservation Initiative will fix this. The purchase of the 12-acre Gaslight Village defended against further lakeshore development. This site will be transformed into a municipal and environmental park. Through wetland restoration, pollution will be treated before it reaches the lake. Upstream, we purchased the 1,400-acre Berry Pond tract to protect the headwaters of West Brook and watershed from Lake George.
